3. DISCUSSION:

1. Attached binder contains nine (9) range waivers common to all units assigned to Fort Benning. Director DPTMS intent is to create common waiver that meets majority of requirements for live fire specific to a range. By standardizing, this reduces administrative burden on units to create files and process for review/signature.

2. All waivers have been fully staffed & coordinated. There have been no changes since last approval and no reportable incidents caused by violations of the waiver conditions.

3. Waivers are kept on file. When needed, a unit commander is only required to add his/her unit risk management worksheet to the waiver packet.

4. By Army policies and regulations, all waivers must be reviewed and renewed annually. The previous waiver is contained under each tab.

SUBJECT: Waiver for Malone 12 (Machine Gun Transition Zero/Record Fire)

1. REFERENCES:

2. Training to be conducted: Malone 12 is a Machine Gun Transition Zero/Record Fire Range in the Malone Range Complex. Based on weapons and ammunition used the Surface Danger Zone (SDZ) impacts the right side of Malone 11.

3. Area to be waived: The portion of the SDZ which crosses the right side of Malone 11.

4. Controlling Factors: Each firing point has lane markers that clearly define the limits of the target area to be engaged. Every firing point is elevated and each lane has a clear unobstructed field of fire to its targets. Weapons are fired from a stable prone position. Range Safety Officer and Lane Safeties monitor training and enforce range safety SOP's. The first targets are located 400 meters downrange causing significant reduction in probability of ricochet onto Malone 11. Soldiers are briefed on range/target layout and limits of engagement prior to firing. There is an 8 foot high berm and higher terrain separating the firing lines of Malone 11 and Malone 12. Designated as a standard target range only, no steel targets are used on this range to further mitigate the risk of injury due to ricochet. No one proceeds beyond the 25 meter line on Malone 11.

5. Composite Risk Management factors were considered in the development of the Range Safety Waiver. Units will be responsible for having the Composite Risk Management Worksheet for this range, completed and signed by appropriate personnel turned into Range Control prior to firing on this range.


6. Under the provision of the references and controlling factors above, the portion of the SDZ which crosses the right side of Malone 11 is waived.

7. This waiver is valid for the period of one year when used in conjunction with live fire range scenario and risk management worksheet. In the event of an accident arising from the use of the waived condition, this waiver is invalid until reinstated by this headquarters.

3. Concur w/comment.

a. Waiver document, paragraph 3. Recommend standardized use of the T&E mechanism to help master the four fundamentals of marksmanship (T&E manipulation, sight adjustments, crew drill, and fire commands) and prevent overshooting of the earthen berm.

b. Waiver document, paragraph 4. Delete all terminology using "composite" when referring to Risk Management. Composite is an antiquated term, no longer used.



c. Waiver document and FB Form 350-19-1-R-E. Replace all verbiage with "Deliberate Risk Assessment Worksheet", dated April 2014, in place of the Composite Risk Assessment.

4. The full performance of the Army Techniques Publication 5-19, Risk Management and DD Form 2977, begins immediately with full implementation set for 01 May 2015. The DD Form 2977 has replaced the DA Form 7566. The mandatory use of the 2977 is predicated upon the attrition of each form renewal, change in the risk approval authority, or document update.
