



LTC Andrew Koloski is a native of Juneau, Alaska and a 1992 graduate of the United States Military Academy at West Point, New York. Commissioned as an Armor officer with a degree in American History, LTC Koloski was first assigned to 3-69 AR, part of the 24th and later the 3rd Infantry Division, at Fort Stewart, Georgia. While assigned to 3-69 AR, he served as tank platoon leader, tank company executive officer, headquarters company executive officer, and assistant operations officer during several rotations to the National Training Center and deployment to Kuwait.

After completing the Armor Officer Advanced Course at Fort Knox, Kentucky, LTC Koloski was assigned to 2nd BDE, 1st Armored Division in Baumholder, Germany. While a member of the Iron Brigade, LTC Koloski served as the BDE S4, BN S3 for 1-35 AR, assistant BN S3, and tank company commander for D & A/1-35 AR, including deployment on a peacekeeping tour to the Balkans. Upon completion of his company command tour, LTC Koloski earned his MA in American History from Stanford University before completing a three year assignment teaching American History at West Point as an instructor, department executive officer, and assistant professor.

Following completion of the Command and General Staff College at Fort Leavenworth, Kansas in 2006, LTC Koloski was assigned as the BN XO for 1-30 IN, part of 3rd BDE, 3rd Infantry Division at Fort Benning, Georgia. During his two year tour as XO, LTC Koloski was responsible for transforming the Infantry battalion into an Armored Reconnaissance Squadron and deploying 3-1 CAV in support of Operation Iraqi Freedom from March 2007 to May 2008 as part of “the surge.”

In June 2008, LTC Koloski selected to serve as the advanced party for the Armor School at Fort Benning, Georgia, responsible for planning the School’s BRAC move from Fort Knox, Kentucky. After serving as a strategic planner for two years, LTC Koloski was most recently assigned as the Professor of Military Science, Duke University, Army ROTC in Durham, North Carolina.

LTC Koloski’s awards and decorations include: the Bronze Star Medal, Meritorious Service Medal (3 awards), Army Commendation Medal (3 awards), Army Achievement Medal (3 awards), Combat Action Badge, and Parachutist Badge.
