

## CRC WEBSITE FAQ REDEPLOYMENT

Q. What is the best day to report to CRC for redeployment?

A. Tuesday or Wednesday for Army Reservists, Army National Guard, and full-time National Guard (AGR-32). Monday through Saturday for Active Duty, other Branches of the military (active and reserve), AGR-10, and Civilian personnel.

Q. How long will redeployment take?

A. Depends on the day of arrival. It takes from 3-7 days for Army Reserve/National Guard and 1-2 days for all other personnel. If you have CIF, medical, or administrative issues, the process could take longer.

Q. My Company deployed through another location. Can I redeploy with them at that station?

A. Yes. You must get approval from First Army to do so.

Q. Can I turn in my gear someplace in the theater of operations?

A. Yes you can. However, you must return to the CRC and provide proper documentation of accountability. You will still be required to go to CIF to receive final clearance.

Q. Can someone else turn in my gear for me?

A. It is not advisable. If there are shortages, the person will have to pay for it.

Q. Should I make travel reservation before arriving to CRC for redeployment?

A. No. You should wait until you arrive and have spoken with a Cadre member to see when you will be finished with your out-processing.

Q. I am returning on the Freedom Flight. Where can my family meet me?

A. Your family may meet you at Freedom Hall when you arrive.

Q. I didn't receive anything while I was at CRC. Do I still need to redeploy back through CRC?

A. Yes. If you processed through the CRC, you must return to out-process and clear the CRC unless your orders state otherwise.

Q. Do I need to turn in my ID Card when I redeploy?

A. If you are a Contractor, you will be required to turn in your CAC Card regardless of where it was issued. If you are a DA/DOD Civilian and you were issued a CAC Card at Ft. Bliss or Ft. Benning, you will be required to turn in your CAC Card.
