

## Best Ranger Permissive Jump Packet

References: DA MSG 2017512MAR00: Permissive Parachuting Program  
USAIC Regulation 350-3 Para 3-2, 3-3 and 3-4.

Purpose: For soldiers assigned to Fort Benning, GA or other Installations who are not on Hazardous Duty Orders for parachuting.

The Permissive Parachuting Program is for experienced Army Airborne qualified soldiers assigned to non-airborne duty positions. Soldiers must have a valid need to perform parachuting in conjunction with the performance of their current duties and/or have a desire to maintain their parachuting skills in preparation for a future (on orders) airborne assignment.

**Packets must contain the following:**

- 1) **DA Form 4187** signed by the MACOM Commander, O-6 or above. (see example)
- 2) **Memorandums** from chain of command (**Battalion & Regiment**) requesting and giving approval from their levels to the next. (see example) **Note- very important to have a good phone # and POC, failure to give will result in packet not being processed if problems occur.** (see example)
- 3) Copy of current **APFT Card** with height/weight filled out. (must be in good physical shape and in compliance with AR 600-9, The Army weight control Program)
- 4) **DA Form 1307** Jump Log. (need to see when last jump was and total # of jumps. Need to see the soldier meets the 3 cumulative years of parachuting duty in an Airborne position. If not will require a DA exception to policy).
- 5) **Copy of ORB or ERB**( Need to see the soldier meets the 3 cumulative years of parachuting duty in an Airborne position. If not will require a DA exception to policy).
- 6) **Copy of Parachute badge / Ranger Tab orders**

NOTE: Processing time once received is approximately 21 workdays. If DA exception to policy is required for the 3-year rule then add one week.
