NAMES OF STREETS WITHIN BATTLE PARK HOMES

1. The streets within Battle Park Homes are designated by the names indicated on the attached sketch in honor of selected deceased Medal of Honor Infantrymen (junior officers) in World War II.
2. The name of Arrowhead Road remains unchanged.
3. Briefs of the citations for the Medal of Honor are as follows:

BEAUDOIN, Raymond O. (1st Lt). Hamelin, Germany; 30th Inf. Div.; 6 April 1945. To relieve the pressure on his platoon, he made a one-man attack on an enemy sniper nest. At point-blank range he shot and killed two of the enemy and killed another with the butt of his carbine. As he started to continue his attack he was killed by a machine-gun burst.

LLOYD, Edgar H. (1st Lt). Near Pompey, France; 80th Inf. Div.; 14 September 1944. When his unit was held up by a strong enemy defensive position, he ran to an enemy machine-gun nest, knocked out the gunner with his fist, dropped a grenade and jumped out before it exploded. He then went from one nest to another, destroying them with hand grenades.



THE INFANTRY SCHOOL LIBRARY

1. References:

- a. AR 35-6800
- b. AR 350-110
- c. AR 380-5

2. GENERAL:--The Infantry School Library is a permanent library within the definition of reference 1a above, and is operated under the direction of the Assistant Commandant.

3. PURPOSE AND SCOPE:

a. To provide a reference collection of books, documents, maps and related material pertaining to military matters and to allied subjects.

b. To provide research assistance and loan service primarily for the students and faculty of The Infantry School and secondly, for other military personnel of Fort Benning.

4. ORGANIZATION:

a. Authorized Operating Personnel

- (1) Librarian: A commissioned officer in charge of the Academic Library. This officer is immediately responsible for the efficiency of operation and the administration of the library.
- (2) Civil Service librarians and typists as authorized.
- (3) Enlisted personnel as authorized by Tables of Distribution.

b. Accountability

- (1) The librarian is the accountable property officer for the library.

(Circular No, 13 Hq TIG 15 May 50) (Contd)

- (2) The library will be operated and records maintained as prescribed in references cited above.

c. Library Committee

- (1) As provided in reference 1b above, a library committee consisting of the following is appointed:

Chairman: Secretary, The Infantry School  
Member: Representative, Director of Instruction  
Member: Representative, Analysis and Research Office  
Recorder: Librarian

- (2) Representatives of Directors of Departments of the Academic Department are designated as ex-officio members to meet with the committee at the call of the chairman when matters are to be considered which specifically affect their departments.

- (3) This committee, subject to the approval of the Assistant Commandant, is charged with the general supervision of the library, including the preparation of regulations for administration and interior economy, and the selection of books, periodicals, and other publications and supplies.

FUNDS:—Funds necessary for the operation and maintenance of the library will be made available by sub-allotment from appropriated funds for the operation of The Infantry School.

5. General Orders Number 29, Headquarters The Infantry School, 18 May 1946, which pertained to this subject was rescinded by General Orders 32, this headquarters, 15 May 1950.

NAMES OF STREETS WITHIN NEW NONCOMMISSIONED OFFICERS'  
QUARTERS AREA, MAIN POST, FORT BENNING, GEORGIA

1. The street located within the new noncommissioned officers' quarters area, lying immediately north of Carpenter Street and bounded on the west by Edwards Street and on the east by Ingersoll Street as indicated on the attached sketch, is hereby designated Burr Street in honor of First Sergeant Elmer J. Burr, 20647479, deceased Medal of Honor Infantryman of the 32d Infantry Division in World War II.

2. The street located immediately north of Burr Street, bounded on the west by Edwards Street and on the east by Ingersoll Street as indicated on the attached sketch, is hereby designated Carey Street in honor of Technical Sergeant Charles F. Carey, Jr., 6253699, deceased Medal of Honor Infantryman of the 100th Infantry Division in World War II.

3. Briefs of citations for the Medal of Honor are as follows:

Burr, Elmer J., 20647479 (1st Sgt). Near Buna, New Guinea; 32d Infantry Division; 24 December 1942. During an attack he saw an enemy grenade strike near his company commander. Instantly, he threw himself upon it, smothering the explosion with his body, thus giving his life to save that of his commander.

Carey, Charles F., Jr., 6253699 (T/Sgt). Near Rimling, France; 100th Infantry Division; 8 January 1945. He demonstrated unsparing leadership when he destroyed a German tank, captured 16 Germans in a house, and led the rescue of 2 American squads after the enemy had overrun part of his battalion position.


The classroom building located on Ingersoll Avenue at the northeast corner of Gordon Field (Building 328), coordinates (91.67-82.05) on Map: (Transverse Mercator Projection) Fort Benning, Georgia, Scale 1:25,000, Sheet 4048 IV SW, is named "LLOYD BROWN HALL" in honor of the late Major General Lloyd D. Brown, who commanded the 28th Infantry Division (Key-stone Division) from February 1943 to August 1944 and was Director of Instruction of The Infantry School from 3 September 1944 to 1 January 1949.

NAMES OF AVENUES AND COURTS WITHIN CUSTER ROAD TERRACE

1. The avenues and courts within Custer Road Terrace are designated by the names indicated on the attached sketch in honor of selected deceased Medal of Honor Infantrymen of the Third Infantry Division in World War II.

2. Briefs of the citations for the Medal of Honor are as follows:

CHRISTIAN, Herbert F., 35592775 (Pfc). Near Valmontone, Italy; 15th Infantry, 3d Infantry Division; 2-3 June 1944. Although his right leg was severed above the knee, he attacked a strong enemy position killing at least 4 Germans and distracting their fire in order that his 12 comrades might escape from an ambush.

*GO 32 15 MAY 50*  
CRAIG, Robert, 01399050 (2d Lt). Favoratta, Sicily; 15th Infantry, 3d Infantry Division, 11 July 1943. He deliberately drew the concentrated fire of a force of approximately 100 Germans so his platoon could withdraw to safety. Before he went down, mortally wounded, he killed 5 German soldiers and wounded 3 others.

GIBSON, Eric, 36004320 (Cpl). Near Isola Bella, Italy; 30th Infantry, 3d Infantry Division, 28 January 1944. Although his primary duty was a cook, he single-handedly charged and captured 4 German automatic weapons positions, killed 5 Germans, captured 2 and secured the left flank of his company during an attack in which he gave his life.

*L (GO 32, 15 MAY 50*  
KESSLER, Patrick J., 35473422 (Pfc). Near Ponte Rotto, Italy; 30th Infantry, 3d Infantry Division; 23 May 1944. In one whirlwind action, he dealt alone with an enemy machine-gun nest, a strong-point with its machine gunners and riflemen plus several individual snipers. He killed 4 Germans and captured 16 more enabling his unit to advance to its objective.

*15 May 50*  
MERRELL, Joseph F., 42179710 (Pvt). Near Lohe, Germany; 15th Infantry, 3d Infantry Division; 18 April 1945. Entirely on his own initiative, he made a single-handed assault running through 100 yards of concentrated fire to kill 4 Germans at point-blank range. Armed only with grenades he moved on to kill several Germans before being killed himself.

SQUIRES, John C., 35706627 (Sgt). Near Padiglione, Italy; 30th Infantry, 3d Infantry Division; 23-24 April 1944. A platoon messenger, he used a captured German machine gun to repel several enemy counterattacks. As a result of his determined resistance, he captured 13 other machine guns and took 21 prisoners single-handedly.

VALDEZ, Jose E., 38352446 (Pfc). Near Rosenkrantz, France; 7th Infantry, 3d Infantry Division; 25 January 1945. While slowly bleeding to death from a painful stomach wound, he single-handedly fought off an attack by 2 German companies with his automatic rifle, directed an artillery barrage on the SS troops in front of him and saved his patrol and possibly his company from annihilation.

KANDLE, Victor L., 01324419 (1st Lt). Near LaForge, France; 15th Infantry, 3d Infantry Division; 9 October 1944. He led a small group of riflemen and machine gunners to take a German mountain-quarry fortress that had held off a battalion 2 days. In doing so he killed a German officer in a duel and then rushed forward to force the enemy in the quarry to surrender, destroyed two machine gun crews, and captured 32 more enemy.


Sketch of Custer Road Terrace
