MISSION

The Maneuver Leader Maintenance Course develops and educates the Maintenance and Logistics competence of Maneuver Leaders from the grades of O1-O3 and E6-E8 to standardize a current base level of Maintenance.

PURPOSE

Develop maneuver leaders in the fundamentals of the Army Maintenance Systems and Logistical Operations. These skills taught will provide leaders with assignments as Company Executive Officers (XOs) and Battalion Motor Officers (BMOs) the ability to build and sustain combat power in joint combined arms maneuver in an expeditionary environment as part of a Joint Task Force of a Brigade Combat Team.

SCOPE

This is a ten day course to develop maneuver leaders expertise in battalion and small unit level maintenance operations. Students will learn maintenance fundamentals, how to run a command maintenance program with an emphasis on Preventative Maintenance Checks and Services (PMCS) and 5988E flow. Students will learn to execute command maintenance and a Commander's Inspection Program (CIP) for maintenance to the Army standard. Additional instruction focuses on maintenance information systems, how battalion/squadron level systems interface with higher level maintenance organizations and Global Combat Support System-Army (GCSS-A) to order repair parts for the battalion/squadron. Using GCSS-A, students will track and account for all battalion/squadron level materiel readiness financial resources. Students learn to assess materiel readiness issues using business intelligence and business warehouse tools. Students will apply AR 750-1 to determine the effectiveness of a Command Maintenance Discipline Program (CMDP). Students will learn to conduct maintenance in the tactical environment including recovery operations and the planning considerations for UMCP emplacement.





OVERVIEW

Students will receive additional instructions that focuses on maintenance information systems, how battalion level systems interface with higher-level maintenance organizations and systems. Systems such as the Global Combat Support System- Army (GCSS-A) will be used to order repair parts for the battalion.

Students learn the Command Maintenance Program, Equipment Service Program, Equipment Deadline tracking, GCSS-A Maintenance and Supply reports, Logistics Information Warehouse (LIW) tools, Supply Support Activity (SSA) procedures & tour, the Battalion/Squadron Maintenance meeting format and expected outcomes, the Army Materiel Maintenance Program, and Tactical Field Maintenance/Tactical Planning Considerations.

At the conclusion of this course, Leaders will have the knowledge to properly train Soldiers on crew/operator Field Level Maintenance tasks and effectively manage/maintain combat power projection platforms to sustain land warfare dominance capability. Leaders will also be able to assist and/or execute a commander's inspection program for maintenance to the Army standard.

COURSE OUTCOMES

1. Leaders who track and account for unit resources in garrison and the operational environment to support combat operations in a complex world.

2. Leaders who properly manage Soldiers on crew/operator Field Level Maintenance tasks and ensure compliance in accordance with the appropriate technical manual.

3. Leaders who effectively maintain combat power projection platforms to sustain land warfare dominance capability and are able to conduct Joint and multinational operations over the entire spectrum of conflicts, both offensive and defensive.

4. Leaders who develop and sustain maintenance programs which are synchronized within their UTP and focus on ensuring their equipment is ready to go to war.





PREREQUISITES

This course is open to all Active Army and Reserve Component officers in the ranks of Lieutenant thru Captain with branches of Armor and Infantry.

CMF 19 and 11 Soldiers in the rank of SFC thru MSG with the MOS of 11Z/B/C or 19Z/D/K may attend with waiver.

NLT 2 weeks before the start date, complete the training on GCSS and have access to LIW, Blackboard, and FMS WEB.

 - Government/immediate Supervisor. If your immediate supervisor at your unit does not have access, use one of the instructors listed below to get approval.
 - Notify your Supervisor and S2 and have them respond to the email from LIW (Supervisor and PSM must respond to email within 15 days).

 - Once logged in... Click on the App Warehouse ICON (White Star/Yellow background) – another window (App Warehouse) will appear.
 - In the Keyword Search box type in the following:

 - PARTS TRKR when it appears click on create shortcut.
