First Sergeant Jesse A. Boell hails from Schleswig, Iowa, and graduated from Kearney High School in 2007. After graduation, he attended One Station Unit Training at Fort Knox, KY, earning the Military Occupational Specialty of M1 Armor Crewman.

First Sergeant Boell has held every position as an Armor Crewman on the M1A2 Abrams and the Stryker Mobile Gun System Platforms. He has served in multiple units including the 2nd Battalion, 9th Infantry Regiment, Camp Casey, South Korea, 1st Battalion, 35th Armor Regiment, Fort Bliss, Texas, 5th Squadron, 1st Cavalry Regiment, Fort Wainwright, Alaska and the 1st Battalion, 16th Infantry Regiment, Fort Riley, Kansas. He held the positions of Platoon Sergeant and Company First Sergeant for Bandido Charlie Company, 1-16 Infantry Battalion, with whom he deployed to eastern Europe in support of Operation Atlantic Resolve to Bulgaria, Romania and Greece.

First Sergeant Boell has also served in multiple broadening assignments, to include recruiting with the Columbus, Ohio Recruiting Battalion as well as an instructor for the Mobile Gun System Commander Course at Fort Benning, GA. Most recently, he held the position of the 19K Career Management NCO with the Office of the Chief of Armor.

His military education includes all levels of PME up to Master Leaders Course. He is also a graduate of M1A2 SEP Master Gunner Course. First Sergeant Boell holds an Associate of Science Degree in Business Marketing from Post University and is currently studying Human Resources Management at Troy University.

His awards include the Meritorious Service Medal, Army Commendation Medal (7th award), Army Achievement Medal (5th award), Army Superior Unit Award, Overseas Service medal (3rd Award), Master Gunner Identification Bade and the Recruiting Badge Silver. He has been inducted into the Order of St. George, Bronze Medallion and the Order of St. Maurice.

GUEST SPEAKER SGM ROCKY KUNKEL

SGM Kunkel joined the United States Army out of Greeley, Colorado on 2 September 2003. He completed One Station Unit Training at Fort Knox, Kentucky. Upon graduation, he received the MOS 19K, Armor Crewmen.

SGM Kunkel found himself in the tundra of Alaska, stationed at Fort Richardson for his first duty station. He trained and deployed with the 1-72nd Stryker Brigade to Iraq in 2004. He transitioned to Fort Lewis, Washington, where he assisted in forming the 5th Stryker Brigade Combat Team. SGM Kunkel served as a Mobile Gun System (MGS) Vehicle Commander in the 2nd Battalion 1st Infantry Regiment. He deployed to Afghanistan in 09-10. He completed 24 months as a Drill Sergeant in Bulldog Company 1st Battalion-81st Armor Battalion at Fort Benning, GA. Stationed at Fort Hood, Texas, SGM Kunkel established himself as a competent and confident Platoon Sergeant in Cobra Company, 2nd Battalion 8th Cavalry. In 2014 he deployed the first-ever Tank Platoon into the Baltics in support of Operation Atlantic Resolve. SGM Kunkel assumed duties as a Tank Company 1SG in August 2015. During his 24 months as a Tank Company 1SG, he deployed to Korea for nine months. SGM Kunkel was selected over his peers to assume responsibility as the HHC Brigade 1SG for 1st Brigade 1st Cavalry at Fort Hood, TX. He completed a combined 36 months as a 1SG. He was selected to become an Observer, Coach/Trainer at the National Training Center located in Fort Irwin, CA. SGM Kunkel served on the Cobra Team within Operations Group and completed over 20 rotations. In 2019 SGM Kunkel was selected to attend the Sergeants Major Academy located at Fort Bliss, TX. Upon graduation he was assigned as the Chief Instructor with the 5th Squadron 15th Cavalry Regiment located at Fort Benning, GA. Then, SGM Kunkel served as the Command Sergeant Major for the 3rd Battalion 67th Armor Regiment at Fort Stewart, GA. He deployed the Hound Battalion (3-67AR) to Lithuania for 9 months in support of Operation Assure, Deter and Reinforce. Currently he is serving as the BDE OPS SGM of 316th Cavalry Brigade at Fort Benning, GA.

SGM Kunkel's military and civilian education include a Bachelors Degree in Leadership and Workforce Development and an Associates' degree in Applied Science. He is a graduate of the following courses, M1A2 SEP Master Gunner Course 003-15, Improved Target Acquisition System, Army Basic Instructor course, Stryker Infantry Carrier Vehicle Operator course, Stryker Mobile Gun System Vehicle Operator course, United States Army Drill Sergeant School, Combatives Level I and II, 19K One Station Unit Training, Unit Armorers course, SBCT Battle Staff NCO Course, and the Stryker Leaders course.
