## **COL JUSTIN D. HARPER**

Colonel Justin D. Harper is a native Texan and Armor Officer commissioned from Texas A&M University in 2002. His first unit of assignment was 2-12 Cavalry Regiment at Fort Cavazos, Texas, where he deployed in support of Operation Iraqi Freedom, serving as a Tank Platoon Leader and Task Force Scout Platoon Leader. COL Harper returned to Fort Cavazos for his next operational assignment with the 3rd Armored Cavalry Regiment. While with 3d ACR, he served as a Regimental Assistant S3 and Squadron Assistant S3.
