#### **DES Updates Spring Break Safety Tips**

- Know the criminal threats/risk of the country you are traveling to. Review the State Dept website.
   US Dept State Travel Advisories
   https://travel.state.gov/content/travel/en/traveladvisories/traveladvisories.html
- **Arrive safely.** If you can't avoid night driving, have at least one person stay awake to talk to driver.
- Don't take chances at your hotel. Lock the doors, and secure important belongings like passports and wallets in the safe.
- Don't tell new acquaintances your hotel or room number. You never know who has innocent or dangerous intentions.
- Protect your location. Limit your social media presence. Be cautious about revealing personal information and your location through status updates or tweets.
- Carry cash and phone numbers. And take a copy of your credit cards in case they are stolen.

- Use the buddy system; Practice safe drinking; Hydrate and wear sunscreen.
- If you're traveling outside of the country: Sign up online for the **Smart Traveler Enrollment Program (STEP)**. STEP enables the State Department to contact you in case of a family emergency, or to notify you of a crisis near your travel destination. Take a copy of your passport.
- Look up the address or contact information for the American consulate or U.S. Embassy in the country where you're headed. Tell friends and relatives in the U.S. of your travel itinerary and check in with them often.
- Know what to do in an emergency. In foreign nations, the phone number for emergency response is NOT 9-1-1.
- Call your credit card and cash card companies in advance to let them know you'll be out of the country, so they won't put a stop on your account.
- Obtain an overseas cell plan; Can be costly




