

The Army announced its intention to prepare an Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) for managing and accommodating increased training requirements at Fort Benning, Georgia (Maneuver Center of Excellence EIS) in the Federal Register on March 18, 2008. This proposed action is needed to transform the Army, meet the increased national security and defense requirements of the 21<sup>st</sup> century, maintain training and operational readiness levels of the force, and preserve a high quality of life for U.S. Soldiers and families.

This announcement, on April 2, 2008, initiates the start of the 30-day public involvement process. As part of this process, the *Army is holding a scoping meeting* at the location below and invites your participation. This meeting will be held in an open house format (meaning there are no formal presentations), and your participation will assist Army representatives identify issues/concerns associated with the proposed action, define the scope of analysis for the EIS, and identify reasonable alternatives and mitigation.

Army representatives, displays, and informational material will be available at the meeting on *Tuesday*, *April 22<sup>nd</sup>*, *2008 from 3 p.m. to 5 p.m. and 6 p.m. to 8 p.m*. The meeting will be held at the:
