



Fort Benning Transformation Environmental Impact Statement (EIS)

Transformation Proposed Action Overview

For the proposed Transformation action, the Army would undertake: 1) BRAC-directed realignments and restationing actions, 2) BRAC-discretionary realignments and restationing actions, 3) IGPBS movements, 4) AMF initiatives, and 5) other Army stationing actions.

BRAC Directed Realignments

- Relocate the Armor Center and School from Fort Knox, KY to Fort Benning.
- Relocate the 81st Regional Readiness Command (RRC) Equipment Concentration Site (ECS) from Fort Gillem, GA to Fort Benning.
- Close the U.S. Army Reserve Center (USARC) in Columbus, GA and relocate/consolidate units at a new USARC on Fort Benning.
- Relocate the Drill Sergeant School from Fort Benning to Fort Jackson, SC.

BRAC Discretionary Restationing

- Relocate the Criminal Investigation Command (CID) from Fort McPherson, GA to Fort Benning.
- Relocate the 3rd Military Police (MP) Group from Fort Gillem, GA to Fort Benning.
- Relocate the Veterinary Clinic from Fort McPherson to Fort Benning.
- Relocate the Blood Donor Center from Fort Knox, KY to Fort Benning.
- Relocate the 86th MP Detachment from Fort McPherson, GA to Fort Benning.
- Reassign U.S. Army Audit Agency (USAAA) Atlanta field agents to Fort Benning.

IGPBS Movements

- Relocate the 286th Military Police Detachment (Det), an Explosive Ordnance Disposal (EOD) Company (Co), and Movement Control Team from overseas to Fort Benning.

AMF Initiatives

- Continue transformation of the 3rd Infantry Division to create the Army's new heavy brigade combat team force structure and convert the 36th Engineer Group (ENG) to a Sustainment Brigade. The 63rd Engineer Company (Close Support Equipment [CSE]) would be converted to the 11th Engineer Battalion and the 507th Sustainment Group would be activated at Fort Benning.

Other Army Stationing

- The existing Fort Benning Special Operations Command (SOCOM) would gain personnel.
