

Combatives Administrative Information Paper

AS OF 6 JUNE 07

1. **Location:** The Combatives School Headquarters is located in Building 69, 6811 Barron Avenue, Ft Benning, Georgia.

2. **Report Time:** 0800 on the first day of class at Building 69 in combatives uniform. (Students are advised to check in to Olsen Hall the day prior to the first day of training)

3. **Enrollment and scheduling:** Contact ATRRS at: <https://www.atrrs.army.mil/> . The school code for Ft Benning is 071. The course code for Level III is 9E-F12/950-F8, and the course code for Level IV is 9E-F13/950-F9.

4. **General Information:** Requests for information or assistance should be directed to Comm: (706) 545-2811 DSN: 835-2811 or combatives@benning.army.mil .

5. **Uniform:** Soldiers will report with a minimum of three sets of serviceable, sterile BDUs/DCUs/ACUs, boxing hand-wraps and a mouth piece. Additionally, students attending Level III will need a protective cup, a complete PT uniform and have the option of wearing wrestling shoes.

6. **TDY Information:** All Ft Benning soldiers must report with a service school worksheet signed by their commander or equivalent. TDY soldiers must have a copy of their DA Form 1610 when they report for in-processing. Billets will be provided at Olsen Hall and meals are provided Monday-Friday at the Follow Me Dining Facility. TDY should include per diem for weekend meals and other miscellaneous expenses. When necessary students will be given a statement of Non-Availability and directed to find off-post housing for the duration of the course. If necessary, students can contact Ft Benning Lodging at (706) 689-0067.

7. **Prerequisites:** Students enrolling in the level III and IV classes must be graduates of all preceding courses taught by Ft Benning certified instructors. This can be confirmed by visiting the [verify certification](#) link on the Combatives website. Students must also bring certificates and memos with them when they report.

8. **Eye surgery:** Due to the rigorous nature of Combatives, students must arrive physically fit and free of limiting profiles. LASIK / PRK and retina injuries must be identified upon arrival. All Soldiers will have a physical dated within **ONE (1) YEAR** and be cleared for training by their unit medical treatment facility PA or Medical Doctor.

9. **Physical Information:** All level III and level IV students will bring medical records annotating their current physical within **ONE (1) YEAR** for medical screening. Soldiers with medically limiting profile will not be allowed to attend the course.
