

Colonel Stewart (Stew) Lindsay

Colonel Stewart C. Lindsay, a native of Freeport, Pennsylvania, graduated from the University of Pittsburgh in 2001 with a bachelor's degree in materials science engineering and was commissioned as a military intelligence officer.

Col. Lindsay's military career includes attendance at the Military Intelligence Officer Basic Course, followed by his first assignment as assistant intelligence officer with the 1st Battalion, 325th Airborne Infantry Regiment, 82nd Airborne Division at Fort Bragg, North Carolina. He also served as an anti-tank platoon leader, company executive officer and battalion adjutant with the unit. During his time with the 1-325, Col. Lindsay deployed in support of Operation Iraqi Freedom in 2003 and later transferred to the Infantry branch.

After completing the Infantry Captain's Career Course, Jumpmaster Course and Ranger Course in 2005, Col. Lindsay was assigned to the 4th Brigade (Airborne), 25th Infantry Division at Fort Richardson, Alaska, as a brigade plans officer. The brigade deployed to support Operation Iraqi Freedom in 2006-2007, during which he commanded C Company, 3rd Battalion, 509th Infantry (Airborne). After command, he became the brigade's chief of plans and deployed again in support of Operation Enduring Freedom in 2009-2010. In addition to his brigade plans role, he led the U.S. military advisory team partnered with the Afghan 203rd Corps in Gardez, Paktya Province, Afghanistan.

In 2010, Col. Lindsay attended the Command and General Staff College at Fort Leavenworth and concurrently earned a master's degree in international relations from Webster University. He then served as an assistant operations officer at the U.S. Army Special Operations Command at Fort Bragg, North Carolina. In 2012, he was assigned to the 3-509th Infantry (Airborne) as the battalion operations officer during combat operations in Paktya Province, Afghanistan, in support of Operation Enduring Freedom. Following that deployment, he served as the battalion executive officer and then the brigade operations officer for the 4th Brigade (Airborne), 25th Infantry Division. Later, he served on the U.S. Army Alaska staff as the secretary of the general staff and then as the deputy chief of staff.

In 2016, Col. Lindsay was assigned to the U.S. Military Training Mission in Saudi Arabia as an advisor to the Royal Saudi Land Forces, working with the chiefs of infantry, armor, artillery and special operations. He returned to the U.S. in 2017 to serve as the deputy operations officer for the 82nd Airborne Division before taking command of the 2nd Battalion, 325th Airborne Infantry Regiment. The battalion spent two years as the U.S. Immediate Response Force, ready to deploy worldwide on 18 hours' notice. Col. Lindsay later commanded the 2nd Battalion, 2nd Security Force Assistance Brigade, at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, and supported operational deployments to Africa. He graduated from the U.S. Army War College in 2023 with a master's degree in strategic studies and most recently served as the G3 for the 11th Airborne Division in Anchorage, Alaska.

Col. Lindsay is married to Jennifer Eubanks of Anchorage and has five children.
