REPRINTS

We are always pleased to receive requests for reprints of articles. Unfortunately, we do not make reprints. But if you are interested in one of our articles, please feel free to reproduce it (provided it does not carry a copyright notice on its title page). We ask only that you give INFANTRY and the author credit for prior publication.

You can also buy reprints of INFANTRY articles from University Microfilms International, 300 N. Zeeb Road, Ann Arbor, Michigan 48106. Or you can buy a back issue from our subscription service's inventory, if the one you want is available.

FREE COPIES TO FIELD UNITS

The free copies of INFANTRY that are sent to infantry units in the field down to company level are intended for circulation to all members of the organization. Each copy should, ideally, reach about 30 people. So when you're finished reading one of these copies, be sure to leave it in the dayroom for the next person. (If you want your own personal copy to squirrel away, frankly, you can subscribe!)

SUBSCRIPTIONS — NEW AND RENEWAL

When you send in an application for a subscription you can either send payment along with it or ask us to bill you. You should know, though, that if your payment is included we will process it immediately and mail your first issue, while if we have to bill you, we must wait until we receive your payment before mailing that first issue. We're happy to bill you, but it does cause a delay in beginning your subscription.

If you have a subscription and it is up for renewal, you will get the first notice about 10 days after you get your last issue and a second notice about 40 days later. If we get your renewal check by the first week of the month in which we mail our magazines, there will be no interruption in service, but if it arrives later, after our regular mailing has been done, there will be a short delay.

(The magazines are mailed usually between the 15th day and the last day of January, March, May, July, September, and November.)

If you plan to move soon, the INFANTRY staff would like to help you keep your magazines coming. In CONUS your forwarding privileges are good for only 90 days, and magazines cannot be forwarded at all to APOs or FPOs. So let us know as soon as you have your new address so that you won't miss any issues.

If you don't have a firm forwarding address, we'll be glad to hold your issues for you until you're settled.
